# How to Sort Your Garbage

# Please sort your garbage properly!

- Please sort your garbage correctly, and always set it out at the designated location by 8:30 a.m.
- Place your combustible garbage, plastics and incombustible garbage in city-approved pre-paid garbage bags, and tie the mouths of the bags before disposal.
- Place recyclables and hazardous garbage in the basket or a semitransparent bag (since the bags also become garbage, try to fit them in the baskets as much as possible).
- As a rule, items that are 40 cm or greater on any side are considered oversized garbage.

### Recyclables and Hazardous garbage Collected once every two weeks for free

Since bags also become garbage, try to fit them in the baskets as much as possible. Notes: 1. Put hazardous garbage in a bag for disposal.

2. If you are putting items in bags, put them in different bags by category.	
PET bottles	For beverages, alcohol, and condi- ments (soy sauce, mirin, etc.) Only plastic bottles with the PET mark • Remove caps and labels and dispose of as plastics • Wash the insides before disposal • If they cannot be cleaned, dispose of these bottles as incombustible garbage
Cans	Aluminum and steel cans for beer, juice, tea, etc. • Wash the insides before disposal • If they cannot be cleaned, dispose of these cans as incombustible garbage
Metals         Spoons and forks       Pots       Kitchen knives	・Wrap bladed items such as kitchen knives in paper and write "きけん" (Dangerous) on it. ・Dispose of small items such as nails together in a plastic bag or the like.
Bottles Note: Bottles that are not empty can- not be collected.	Glass bottles and jars containing food and beverages (for alcohol, jam, etc.) · Wash thoroughly before disposal · Remove the lids and caps Metal → incombustible garbage Plastic → plastics
Spray cans Note: DO NOT mix with incombustible or other garbage, since it can cause fires or explosions.	<ul> <li>Spray cans (such as for air fresheners), aerosol cans, gas cassettes for tabletop stoves</li> <li>Use up the contents completely before disposal. If it is difficult to empty the can completely, write "なかみあり" (Contents remain) directly on the can or on a note you stick on the can.</li> <li>Items that contained CFCs cannot be collected</li> <li>Even if it is made of plastic, dispose of a container as a spray can if it says "火気厳禁" (fire prohibited) or "高温 に注意" (beware of high temperatures).</li> </ul>
Hazardous garbage	<ul> <li>Put items in a transparent or semitransparent bag, write "ゆうがい" (Hazardous) on the bag before disposal.</li> <li>Put batteries and fluorescent lamps in different bags.</li> </ul> Note: DO NOT mix dry-cell batteries with incombustible or other garbage, because it can cause fires or explosions.



Only those cartons with white insides. Wash them clean, dry, cut open, and bind with string.



ns Put in a transparent or semitransparent n, bag (of up to 45 liters) and force all the air out.



If it is raining at around 8:30 a.m., only cloth will not be collected.


 Put in a transparent or semitransparent bag (of up to 45 liters).

Socks can only be collected as cloth if they are correctly paired; from a sanitary standpoint, always wash underwear and socks to be discarded.

 Examples of items that can be disposed of Clothing, sheets, towel-blankets, blankets, hats, etc.
 × Examples of items that cannot be disposed of Cushions, futons, carpets, swimwear, etc.

#### Branches, grass and leaves Recyclables Collected once every two weeks for free



 Branches
 Bundle with string (do not use metal wire).
 Dispose of branches that are 15 cm or thicker or 1 m or longer as bulky garbage.
 Grass and leaves
 Put in a transparent or semitransparent bag (of up to 45 liters).

## Bulky garbage Fee required (application necessary)



#### **Collection procedures**

1) Confirm the item type, number of items, and size.

- 2) Call the Bulky Garbage Center (Tel: 042-387-9829) to apply.
- Purchase bulky garbage tickets (available at convenience stores or other designated stores in the city).

 Take the items out to a location on your property by 8:30 a.m. on the designated collection day.

- Applications are accepted from Monday to Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5:15 p.m. Note: Applications are also accepted on national holidays (closed on Saturdays, Sundays, and the year-end and New Year's holidays).
- They are also accepted at the Garbage Measures Section service window on the fourth floor of City Office Building No. 2.
- Note: Closed on Saturdays, Sundays, national holidays and the year-end and New Year's holidays.
